- * Make your own sensory bin with muffin ingredients. Use measuring cups and spoons.

WRITE

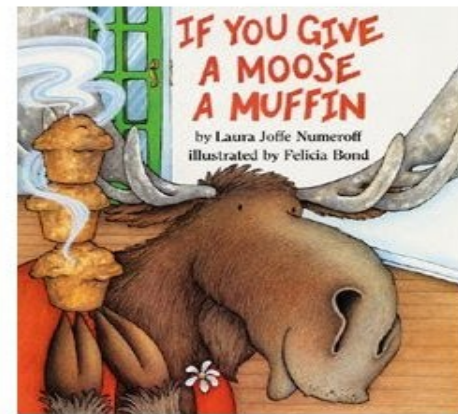
- * Write your own sequencing story. If you give a _____ a _____ he's going..
