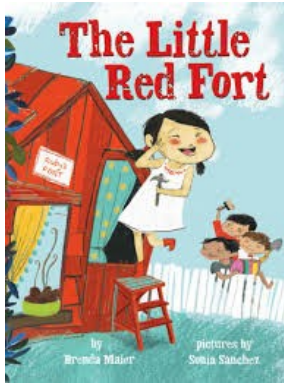

TAKE-HOME IDEAS

Talk:

The Little Red Fort is an adaptation of the classic folktale *The Little Red Hen*. Read both, then compare and contrast the two stories. What's the same in each story? What is different?

Sing:

Sing a song about building or fixing something. For example, you could sing *London Bridge Is Falling Down*, or *I've Been Working On The Railroad*. Can you think of any other songs about building, fixing, or doing work?

Play:

Create your own fort at home with household objects. Bed sheets, tablecloths, or blankets draped over chairs make excellent forts. After you build your fort, go inside with a flashlight, a book and a snack for a cozy fort story time.

Write:

Think about what your dream fort would be like. Write down everything it would have in it, then draw a picture of it.

Read:

Read another folk or fairy tale that involves building something, like *The Three Little Pigs*. Or, read a non-fiction book about careers in construction or architecture.
